---

Grants Systems Service Providers result in:

- Fewer grants systems across government (saves \$)
- More commonality in business processes among agencies sharing systems
- Grants processes less fragmented for grantees
- Simpler installed base to pursue streamlining

## Current Status

---

- | Governance established
  - HHS and NSF are co-managing partners
  - Grants Executive Board provides cross-agency oversight
- | Initial 3 consortia leads identified
  - NSF FastLane
  - HHS/ACF GATES
  - Education G3
- | Major push to get “customer” agencies for consortia
- | Cross-consortia collaboration with GMLoB PMO
  - Identify interfaces (e.g., with Financial systems), processes, policies, approaches to boarding customer agencies
- | Second round of consortia lead selection under way
