“Federal grant outlays are estimated to be \$449.3 billion in FY06 and \$459.0 billion in FY07.”

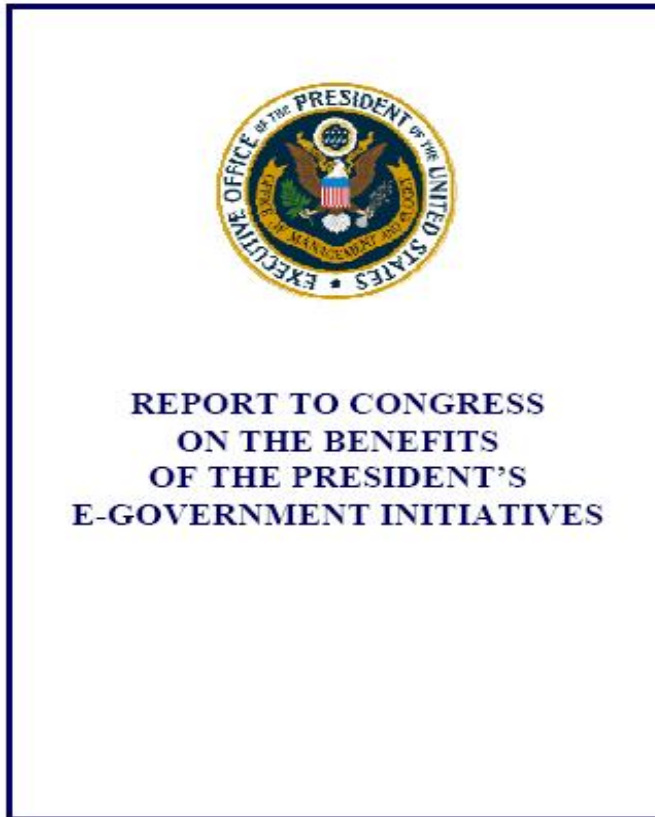
- Fiscal Year 2007 President’s Budget

- Grants.gov is the single access point to find and apply for over 1000 grant programs offered by all Federal grant-making agencies.
- The Grants Management Line of Business provides a government-wide solution to support end-to-end grants management activities promoting:
 - Citizen access
 - Customer service
 - Agency financial and technical stewardship

The Report provides:

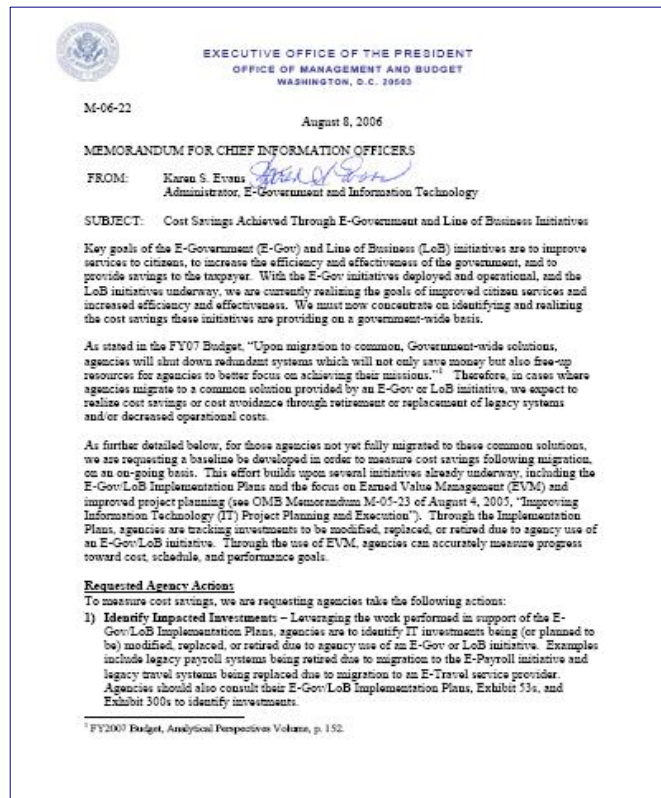
- Purpose of each initiative

Cost Savings Achieved Through E-Gov and LoB Initiatives



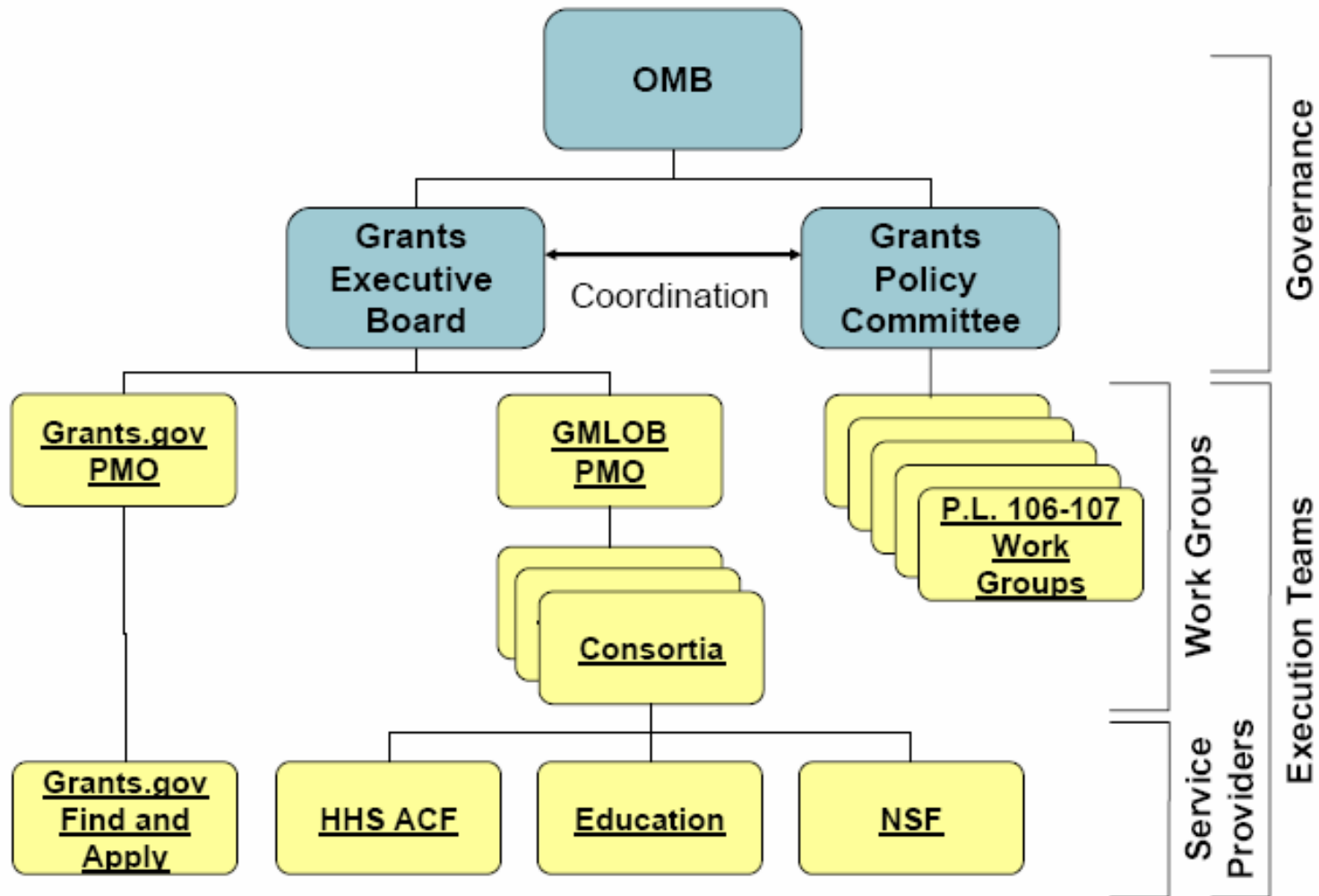
OMB Memorandum M-06-22 requires agencies to:

Grants Governance

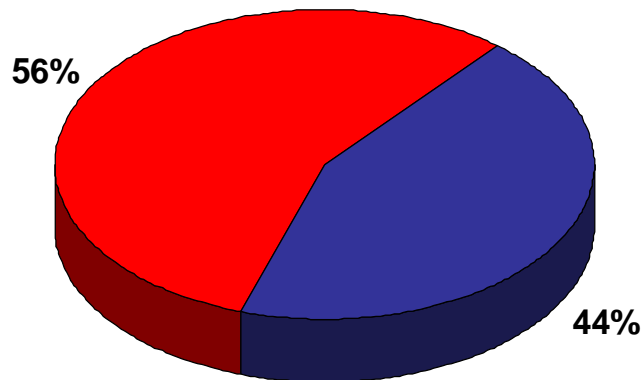




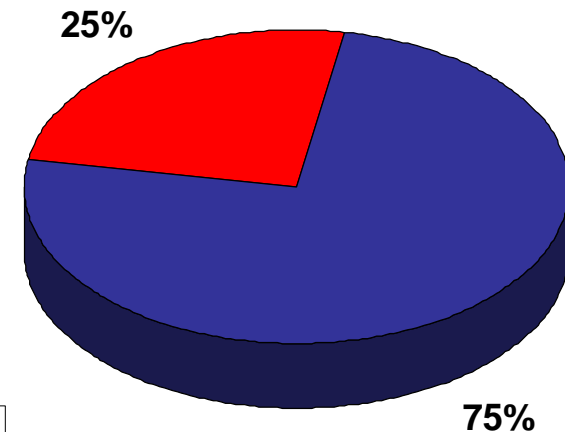
Grants.gov Accomplishments

- This year, the Federal government met its goal to make 75% of discretionary grant opportunities available for electronic submission through Grants.gov.
- This is a 31% increase over the number of opportunities that were available for electronic application submission last year.

Consortia Provider Selection

- *Department of Education*

- The Federal Government is implementing a consortia-based approach that builds upon existing systems
- Agencies are discussing potential partnerships
- The goal is to streamline grant processes and reduce the administrative burden placed on grantees
