4) Facilitate operational efficiencies and effectiveness of Grants Management Organizations

Single User Experience: Streamlined grantee user experience at HHS to provide a single access point, simplified data input and management, and better aligned shared services grants systems to increase efficiencies

Grants Administration Improvements: Process efficiencies that can be leveraged throughout the grants lifecycle by fully analyzing the HHS grants functional landscape in order to decrease administrative burden for grant making agencies and grant recipients
