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What is IAE?

The Integrated Award Environment (IAE) is a government-wide initiative administered by GSA's Federal Acquisition Service (FAS) within the Office of Systems Management (OSM).

- **Reducing barriers** for doing business with the government
- Increasing **transparency** into federal spending
- Increasing **accountability** in the award process
- **Reducing reporting burden**
- Increasing data **quality** and **integrity**

We **facilitate** the federal awards process through multiple online systems that each play a role in the awards lifecycle.

Our systems are used for registering to do business with the federal government, performance reporting, publicizing contract opportunities, collecting contract data, and more.

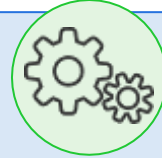




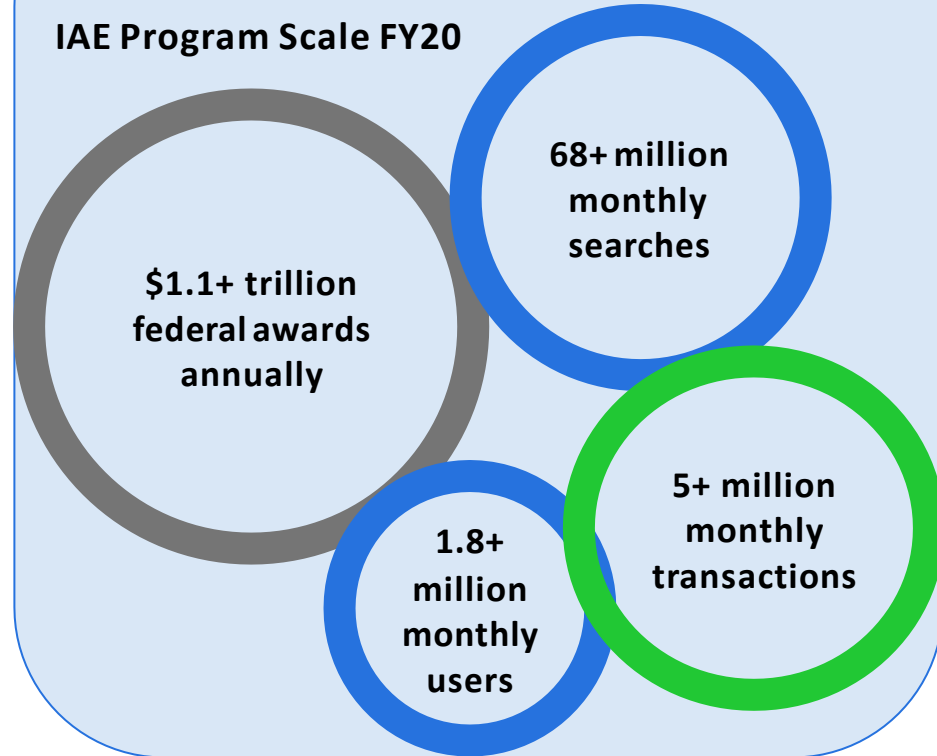

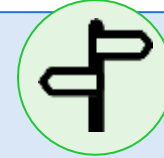

About beta.SAM.gov

Currently, there are two sites with very similar names:

SAM.gov and **beta.SAM.gov**.

What is known today as beta.SAM.gov will eventually become the new SAM.gov and will offer a single login to navigate the federal award lifecycle.

The system is called “beta.SAM.gov” not because it is a traditional beta system, but rather so that it can be differentiated from the current SAM.gov.

IAE Systems Modernization: SAM.gov

SAM.gov and beta.SAM.gov will merge into a single platform to be known as SAM.gov in **April 26, 2021**. All the functionality of both sites will be combined under a new user interface designed to help you find what you need.

The rebranded SAM.gov interface **will change the presentation of current data sets and the user workspace but it will not change their core data or functionality.**

The rebranded SAM.gov will be the place to:

- **register** an entity and update and check the status of registration
- **search** and update entity exclusions and other entity information
- securely **access** APIs and extracts with entity information
- **submit** compliance reporting

The following legacy systems have been decommissioned and their functionalities **successfully transitioned to beta.SAM.gov** or another system:

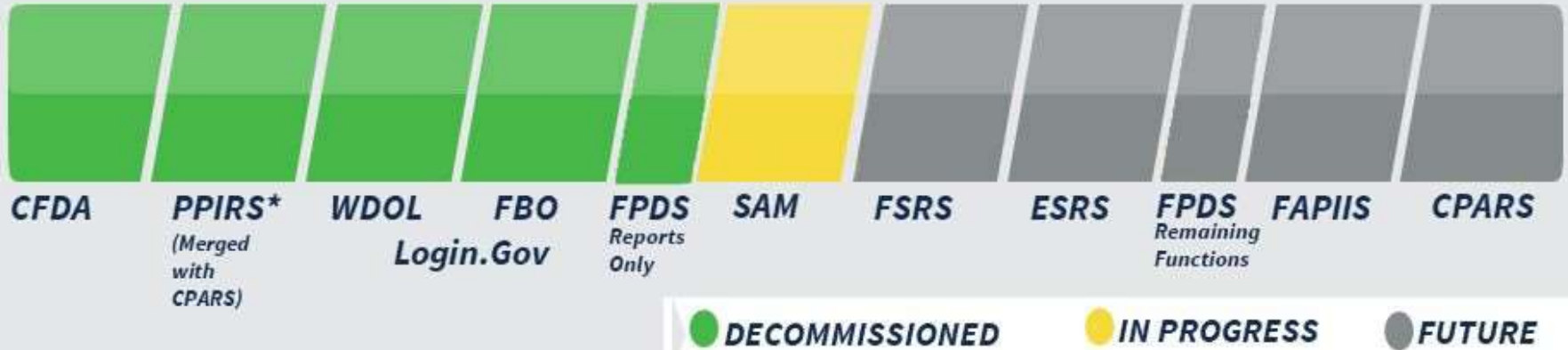
- **Assistance Listings** (CFDA.gov)

- **Contract Data Reports** (FPDS.gov—Reports Only)
- **Wage Determinations** (WDOL.gov)
- PPIRS.gov →merged with CPARS

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IAE Systems Modernization: What's Next?

beta.SAM.gov User Interface Refresh

In **March 2021**, we are releasing a version of beta.SAM.gov with a user interface refresh.

We have updated significant parts of beta.SAM.gov in response to user feedback and new federal digital experience standards. We also made room for SAM.gov and other functions to come into the modernized environment.



SAM.gov

On **April 26, 2021**, the current SAM.gov will be integrated into the beta.SAM.gov environment.

Once integrated, the modernized site will be renamed SAM.gov.

At that point, beta.SAM.gov and SAM.gov will no longer operate in parallel and the term “beta” will be retired.



New Unique Entity Identifier

By **April 2022**, the federal government will no longer use the DUNS Number to uniquely identify entities in IAE systems and throughout the federal award lifecycle.

A new unique entity identifier (UEI) will be assigned to entities already registered in SAM.

Entities that register in SAM for the first time will obtain their UEI as part of the registration process.

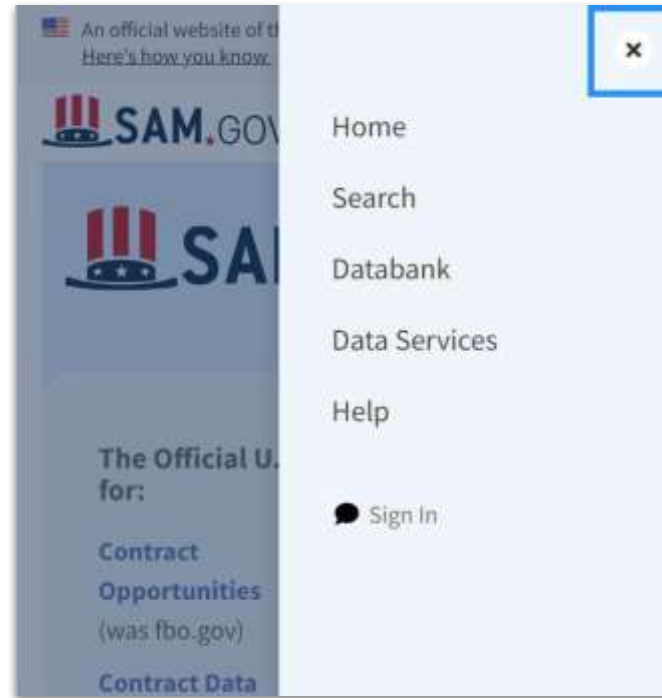
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Responsive Design

Federal Standards now require all modernized websites to support responsive design

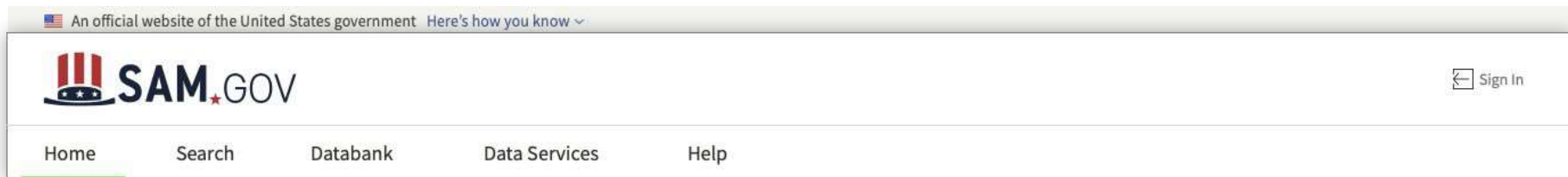
Target for all of SAM.gov to be responsive is Dec 2024

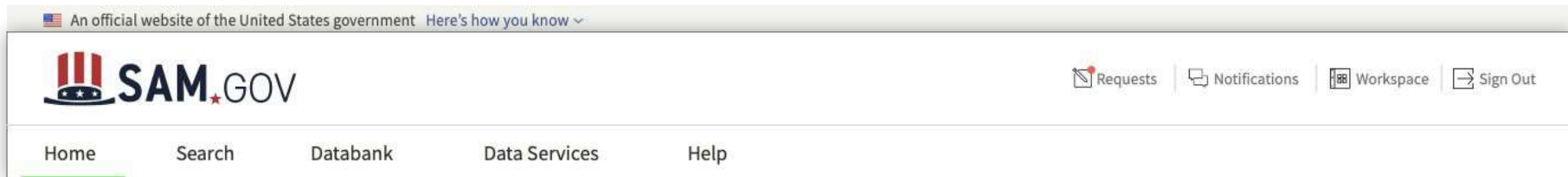


Main Menu

beta.sam.gov is using login.gov to allow you to sign in to your account safely and securely.

i beta.SAM.gov only recognizes the original address used to create the login.gov account. If you choose to have multiple emails associated with your account, your login may fail. Once signed in, you can check your registered email for notifications as listed in your profile page on beta.SAM.gov. To ensure you can continue to login and view other functions, eliminate any additional emails you may have created after the initial setup of your account.

Getting Started with Registration

This is the official U.S. government website for entity registration. Entity registration is FREE.

Before You Get Started

Before you start your registration, there are a few steps you must complete first. Review these steps to help ensure you set aside enough time to complete your registration.

- 1 Request a DUNS Number
- 2 Prepare Your Data
- 3 Get a Login.gov Account
- 4 Submit and Finish

1 Request a DUNS Number

All entities wishing to do business with the federal government must have a unique entity identifier (UEI). Currently, the DUNS number, which is a unique nine-character identification number provided by Dun & Bradstreet (D&B) free of charge, is the official UEI. D&B assigns UEI (DUNS) for each physical location of a business. Requesting a UEI (DUNS) takes about 10 minutes. Receiving a UEI (DUNS) takes 1-2 business days (under normal circumstances) when using the D&B web form.

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IAE Systems Modernization: New Unique Entity Identifier

By **April 2022**, the federal government will no longer use the DUNS Number to uniquely identify entities in IAE systems and throughout the federal award lifecycle.

- Entities with an active registration in SAM **will not need to take action** to obtain their UEI; the government will assign their UEI.
- Entities registering for the first time will be assigned a UEI within SAM as part of the registration process.
- Sub-awardees who currently require a DUNS number for subaward reporting, but are not registered in SAM, will need to go to SAM.gov to obtain their UEI. They will only need to complete a short process to establish their entity affiliation with the new UEI.

IAE Systems Modernization: New Unique Entity Identifier

Currently, the D-U-N-S[®] number is still the official identifier for doing business with the government.

- Entities continue to register in SAM.gov using D-U-N-S[®] number assigned by Dun & Bradstreet (D&B).
- Entity uniqueness continues to be validated by D&B as part of the D-U-N-S[®] number assignment process.

IAE Systems Modernization: New Unique Entity Identifier

The new UEI is stored as a 12-character, alpha-numeric value within databases and passed as such within interfaces and extracts. This 12-character value adheres to the following rules:

- The letters “O” and “I” are not used to avoid confusion with zero and one.
- The first character is not a zero to avoid cutting off digits that can occur during data imports, for example, when importing data into spreadsheet programs.
- Nine-digit sequences are not be used in the identifier to avoid collision with the nine-digit DUNS number or Taxpayer Identification Number (TIN).
- The first five characters are structured to avoid collision with the Commercial and Government Entity code formatting or CAGE code.
- The UEI is not case sensitive.

IAE Systems Modernization: New Unique Entity Identifier

Continued...

- The final character is a checksum of the first 11 characters. Checksums are used to detect errors within data.
- The UEI does not contain the entity's Electronic Funds Transfer (EFT) Indicator. The EFT Indicator will remain a separate field in SAM.gov.
 - Today the "EFT Indicator" in SAM.gov is labeled "DUNS+4".
 - The DUNS+4 field in SAM.gov is used to identify additional bank accounts associated with a single SAM.gov registration. The DUNS+4 is a separate field from the DUNS field in SAM.gov.
 - The DUNS+4 is not provided by D&B but is determined by the entity during registration.
 - Soon, the DUNS+4 field name in SAM.gov will be re-labeled to "EFT Indicator" to align with regulations. The DUNS+4 data provided by entities in that field will not change with the re-labeling.
 - Additionally, when a new UEI is assigned to an entity registration in SAM.gov, the existing EFT Indicator data will not change.

IAE Systems Modernization: New Unique Entity Identifier Transition

Key Transition Milestones Completed

- Released UEI technical specifications - December 2019
- Assigned UEI to entities registering in SAM - May 2020
- Made UEI viewable in non-production (alpha.sam.gov) - June 2020
- Made UEI available in outbound SAM data services - September 2020



IAE Systems Modernization: New Unique Entity Identifier Transition

Key Transition Milestones Remaining

- Implement UEI across all IAE systems - Continues through Q4 FY21
 - Specific dates by system, including testing windows, available by January 2021
- Conduct user testing of entity uniqueness and validation workflow - Q3/Q4 FY21
- Transition IAE systems to using UEI as authoritative identifier - 10/01/2021
 - DUNS Number still accepted, but not primary identifier
 - D&B still providing entity validation services
- Cascade interfacing system cutover to UEI - Q1/Q2 FY22
- Complete UEI transition - April 4, 2022
 - DUNS Number no longer accepted for data entry and inbound interfaces

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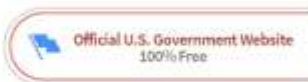
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The IAE and Our Community (After SAM Transition)
